

## NOVEMBER GARDENING

<b>Plant Plants</b>	<p><b>Its time to plant for cooler season.</b></p> <p><b>Annuals</b> - Alyssum, Bluebonnet, Calendula, Dianthus, Drummond Phlox, Pansies, Petunias, Snapdragons, Stock, Violas etc.</p> <p><b>Perennials</b> - Daylily, Salvia, Coneflowers, etc.</p> <p><b>Seeds</b> - Continue to sow for spring bloom - Bluebonnets, Poppies, Larkspur, Sweet Peas, etc.</p> <p><b>Bulbs</b> - Allium, Anemone, Daffodil, Dutch Iris, Paper whites, Ranunculus, etc.</p>
<b>Plant Veggies</b>	<p><b>Set out transplants of</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Broccoli, Cauliflower, Lettuce, Greens, Sugar Snap Peas, etc.</li> </ul>
<b>Plant Herbs</b>	<p><b>Plant now –</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parsley, Sage, Rosemary, etc.</li> </ul>
<b>Roses</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Deadhead to encourage new blooms.</li> </ul>
<b>Trees</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Great time to plant container trees and shrubs.</li> </ul>
<b>Weeding</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue on – weeding is never done!!</li> </ul>
<b>Mulch</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mulch to protect roots from the cold, to conserve moisture and to deter weeds</li> </ul>
<b>Prune</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Still time to lightly prune shrubs</li> <li>• Deadhead spent blooms of annuals and perennials</li> </ul>
<b>Fertilize</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lawns, vegetables, annuals, and hanging baskets</li> </ul>

<b>Water</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As needed newly planted beds, trees, and shrubs.</li> <li>• *Remember to Water well before a freeze.</li> </ul>
<b>Pest</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to watch for Cabbage Loopers in vegetable garden.</li> </ul>
<b>Birds</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep birdbaths cleaned and filled with fresh water.</li> <li>• Keep feeders cleaned and filled with fresh seed</li> </ul>
<b>Butterflies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Enjoy watching them flutter around your garden.</li> <li>• Plant some nectar plants.</li> </ul>
<b>Other Critters</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep a fresh source of water placed on the ground to drink from.</li> <li>• Buy some corn on the cob and put up a squirrel feeder.</li> </ul>

**Note:** Purchase a frost cloth now so you can be prepared to protect your plants in case of a early frost.
