

## Chappell Hill Garden Club Board

The Chappell Hill Garden Club Board meeting began at 3:05. Present were Karen Kubeczka, Bennie Yates, Dale Ramey, Paula Barrett, Angela Rutland and Carol Madeley

**Budget** As of 6/1/19, total revenue was \$1,302.00 and total expenses were \$5,704.15 for a loss of \$4,402.15. As of 4/30/19, the general fund bank balance was \$4,438.17 and the fundraiser bank balance was \$16,717.20. The complete financial reports are attached to the original minutes.

**Correspondence** Thank you notes from Katie Murski, scholarship recipient, and from Bob Markos were read. Bob thanked everyone for the help at the plant exchange at his house. The letters will be read to the membership at the July meeting.

**Scholarship** The board approved a \$500 scholarship for St. Peters Episcopal Church to help send three children to a church musical camp. Angela Rutland will write a letter to Dr. Linda Patterson at St. Peters and enclose a check.

**Programs** On June 12, there will be a field trip to Cuts of Color in Weimar, followed by lunch. Loyce Jardell made reservations for the tour and lunch. Dale Dugas will send emails to the members with all the details. Loyce Jardell will confirm who's coming. We will carpool from the church, leaving at 7:30 am.

**Main Street Cleanup** The next cleanup will be on Wednesday, June 5, starting at 8 am.
